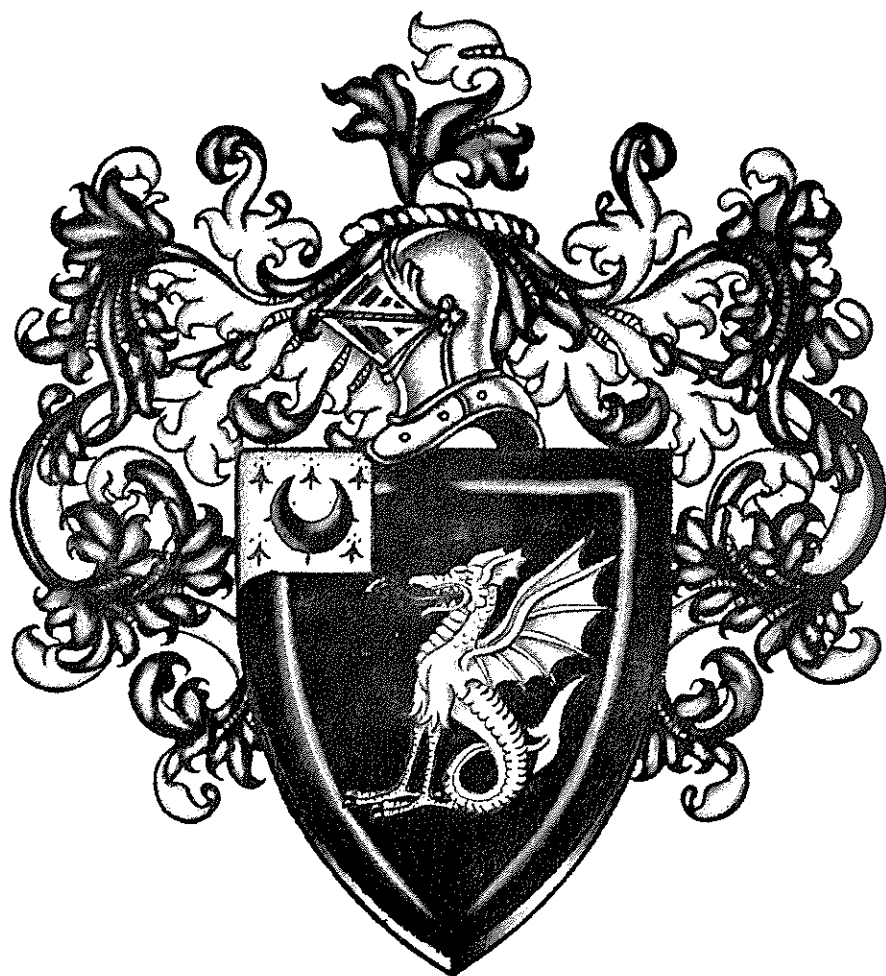

PREFACE

About three years ago, during the Crow Family Reunion which was held at Alabama Landing on the banks of the Ouachita River, the subject of the origin of the Crow Family arose. Some of those present thought that the Crow Family were among those who landed at this point and later settled in the community known as Marion, Louisiana. Before the days of railroads the Alabama Landing was a very popular place for boats bringing supplies for distribution in many North Louisiana parishes, including Union. The consensus of opinion is that it's name came from early settlers in Union Parish who migrated from the State of Alabama and until that date it was my impression that John Crow, my great-grandfather, was from Alabama. The discussion promptly created an interest which was responsible for this study.

Rusha Savage Strother found in a bible belonging to her grandmother, Jerusha Crow Savage, a most helpful letter written to Jerusha in 1892 by Mrs. Lucy A. Wilkinson. Mrs. Wilkinson lived at Rex, Clayton County, Georgia, and she referred in the letter to the fact that she lived near the place from which the Crows departed when they moved to Louisiana. Census records of Henry County from which Clayton County was later formed confirmed the fact that John Crow lived in that county in Georgia in 1840; also, the 1860 Census of Union Parish informed us that John Crow and his four oldest living children were born in Georgia. This information pinpointed the area to make further studies. Mr. John David Humphries, Jr., of Atlanta, Georgia; Mrs. Henry Reed of Athens, Georgia; Mrs. Louise Wert Dunavant's family of Charlotte, North Carolina; and Mr. Greer Stansil Keen of Stockbridge, Georgia, have been most helpful in furnishing information pertaining to the Crow and related families. To them I will be forever grateful.

Heraldry, which deals with coats-of-arms, is a symbol of heritage from the past. Heraldic symbols were introduced with armor in the middle ages and were used to distinguish friend from foe in the heat of battle. The symbols were at first embroidered on a surcoat worn over the armor, giving birth to the name, "Coat-of-Arms". They were used during an age of illiteracy to authenticate deeds and transactions, thus preserving them for posterity.

The crest represents the small ornament worn on the knight's helmet and attached by a twisted cloth, represented on the Coat-of-Arms by a wreath of six skeins.

The mantling or lambrequin represents the cloak or mantle worn over the armor as protection from the elements and to deaden the effect of a sword thrust.

"That these Ensignes of Honour, as are commonly called Armes, which of later times have been chiefly used for distinctions of families, had their original from the practice of great commanders in War, is not unknown to the learned; for certain it is, that the faces of all great military officers, being obscured by such Hoods and Helmets as were anciently worn in times of Battel; it was expedient, that by some other means their persons should be notified to their friends and followers. Necessity, therefore, requiring it, they depicted upon their Shields (which were borne for the defence of their bodies) as also upon their Surcoats of Silke, Banners, Penons, etc., certain Badges, that might make them known at a distance from each other..... In bearing whereof (as appeareth by divers old Rolls of Armes) such order was observed that none might assume another's marks; but that there should be a plain and apparent difference in each man's Shield, Surcote, Banner, Penon, etc., to the end that upon any disorder the common soldier might know his leader, and the better repair to his succour in case of danger.

"But these later times having devised other sorts of armour and weapons both for offence and defence than of old were used; those marks and badges in Shields, Surcoats, etc., have been for divers past ages, as to any such military purpose, totally layed aside; and since merely retained as Honourary Ensignes by the Nobility and Gentry, especially to difference themselves and their families from the vulgar and from one another. In all which the Kings of Arms in their respective provinces were to see due order observed."

The Crow and Stroud Coats-of-Arms appearing on the outside and the inside front covers of this book were prepared by Hennessey Studio of Heraldic Art, Salisbury, North Carolina.

Heraldic Blazon, Shield, Crow Coat of Arms: Gules (red) a chevron between three cocks crowing argent (silver).

Heraldic Blazon, Shield, Stroud Coat of Arms: Sable (black) a wyvern argent (silver) on a canton (square in upper right corner) ermine (the fur) a crescent gules (red).

THE CROW FAMILY

The name Crow (also sometimes spelled Crowe) is first found recorded in 1180 as a surname when we find Ailwin Cawe in the Pipe Rolls of Warwickshire and Nicholas Crowe is found in the Pipe Rolls of Norfolk in 1187. John le Crowe (notice the Norman influence on the name) is recorded in the Subsidy Rolls of Sussex in 1332. It comes from the Old English Cawe 'crow'. In Ireland and the Isle of Man, Crow(e) is a translation of Mac Fiachain meaning "son of Fiachin (the crow)".

The book BRISTOL AND AMERICA includes information that the following persons named Crow (Crowe) sailed from Bristol, England, to America:

ADAM CROWE for Virginia in 1635.
RALPH CROW for Nevis in 1654.
ROBERT CROWE for Barbadoes in 1654.
ANN CROW for Virginia in 1663.
WALTER CROW for Virginia in 1663.

At the time the American Colonies declared their independence from England, the Crow family name had expanded considerably and they can be proud that fourteen Crow patriots are included in the Virginians who served their country in the Revolution. The 1790 Census of Virginia included heads of families named Crow living in Essex, Berkley, Goochland, Madison, King William, Augusta, Montgomery, Brunswick, Lincoln, Bofefont, Hampshire, Culpepper and Sussex Counties.

James Crow is the earliest Crow this study has been able to trace as a direct ancestor and by the time of the Revolution he was living in Chatham County, North Carolina, in the Hillsboro District. James was a Revolutionary Soldier from North Carolina and was included in the first census of the United States as a North Carolinian. The will of James Crow was probated 16 July 1792 and is included herein. In all probability James Crow came from Virginia as did the Aaron Parker family.

At the time of the Revolution two sons of James Crow, Stephen and Isaac, had moved further to the south and west, settling in Franklin (now Clarke) County, Georgia, about seven miles southwest of Athens. Stephen and Isaac fought in the Revolution as Georgia troops.

Stephen Crow married Margaret Stroud, daughter of John Stroud, and Isaac Crow married Elizabeth Stroud, sister to Margaret. John and Sarah Stroud were charter members of the Mars Hill Baptist Church, founded in 1799, located seven miles southwest of Athens. They are buried in the adjoining cemetery. Stephen and Isaac also joined this church prior to 1806 and Stephen is buried in this cemetery.

Barber's Creek meanders through a large area and the Stroud, Parker and Crow families apparently owned a considerable amount of acreage along its banks. This Barber's Creek is referred to in most of the land deeds, and one or more deeds are copied to indicate the loose descriptions used in that day. Stephen Crow purchased land in

Clarke County beginning 8 February 1802 and there are recorded a total of twenty purchases he made before his death in 1830. The Clarke County records show Isaac making nine land purchases during this same period.

Stephen had several children and included herein is information concerning descendants of three of them - Martin, Abner and Eli. Abner later migrated to Alabama where he died. Among his children was Daniel Crow who lived at Moulton, Alabama, around which there must have been a goodly number of Crows as a Crow Cemetery is located there. From this family descends Mrs. Henry Jackson (Louise Wert) Dunavant of Charlotte, North Carolina; also Charles Austin Crow who lives at 2807 Bachman Drive in Dallas, Texas.

Eli Crow and many of his descendants apparently continued to live in Clarke (or more recently subdivided Oconee) County, Georgia, near Athens, and a Jackson Cemetery twelve miles southwest of Athens includes the grave markers of Eli Sr., his wife, and many descendants. James Walter Crow and Dorsey Crow and their family live in this area. One of John Walter Crow's sons named Clovis now lives in Bossier City, Louisiana. (This family in later years chose to add "e" to the name.

Martin Crow married Rachael Parker, a daughter of Aaron Parker, and apparently moved to Henry County about the time that Aaron Parker Jr. moved from Clarke County to Henry County, in 1822. Henry County was later subdivided and DeKalb and Clayton Counties were formed in addition. Martin Crow died prior to his wife, Rachael, and she lived in her later life with a son, Meriday Crow. Meriday, along with his father and mother, are buried in Tanners Church Cemetery just south of Atlanta. Among the children of Martin and Rachael Crow was John, who was married to Leacy Keen in 1834. The 1840 Census of Henry County includes John Crow and three male children under five years of age. The next available information concerning John Crow is revealed in the 1860 Census of Union Parish, Louisiana, which includes John Crow aged 46, birthplace of Georgia, his wife Leacy, and ten children. The four older children, ages 23 to 14, were born in Georgia, the next youngest aged 11 being born in Louisiana. By mathematical calculation, this means John Crow moved from Henry County, Georgia, to Union Parish, Louisiana, between the births of the two children born in 1846 and 1849. John Crow died 15 August 1862 during the Civil War period. Two of his sons, John Washington and William Marion, served in the Confederate forces during the Civil War. William Marion was at Lee's surrender at Appomattox Courthouse, Virginia, on 9 April 1865. It is interesting to note that one of Eli Crow Sr.'s children was also named William and his grave marker in the Jackson Cemetery near Athens reads "He was a Volunteer in the Confederate Army of Co D TRR Cobb's Legion and was with General Robert E. Lee at the surrender." It is hoped that these two cousins named William were aware of each other's presence at that time.

Among the children of John and Leacy Crow, Martin and Jefferson died before marriage and George T. moved to and later died at Joaquin, Texas. All the other children continued to live in Union Parish. Subsequent generations have spread to many states and number literally hundreds. The old John Crow homeplace was about three miles south of

Marion, Louisiana, and is now referred to as the Carpenter Place. In an old cemetery nearby are buried John Crow and his wife Leacy and at least one of their children, Jerusha. William Marion and many of his immediate family are buried at Concord Baptist Church two miles northwest of Marion.

The 1880 Census of Union Parish shows William Marion as the head of a household along with his wife Alice Jane (Cooper), his mother Leacy, then aged 63, and their first child, John Sterling, aged seven months. It is noted that William Marion did not marry until fifteen years after the Civil War and, since his mother was living with him in 1880, it might be assumed that William became the head of the household upon his return from the Civil War, his father having died in 1862.

THE STROUD FAMILY

The original form of the name Stroud was Stroode or Strode, and is of Anglo-Saxon origin, the family originally residing in County Sussex.

The first reference we find to the name was to Aluina de Strodes in the Feet of Fine, of Kent in 1206; Thomas de la (note the Norman influence in the name here) Strode and William Strodde in the Pipe Rolls of Devonshire in 1230; William atte Strode in the Subsidy Rolls of Worcester; and Edytha atte Stroude in the 1327 Subsidy Rolls of Somerset. The name is from the Old English Strod meaning "dweller by the marshy ground", one of those place names so beloved by the early English.

"Sir William Stroud was an associate of Prym, Hampden, Hollis and Hazlerig, in the English House of Commons, during the time of Charles I."

The records state that on 16 April 1621 Sir William moved that "tobacco be banished wholly out of the Kingdom, and that it may not be brought in from any port nor used amongst us."

This was in the reign of James I, and that the Knight was a favorite with his constituents is shown by the fact that he kept his seat through the succeeding reign of Charles I.

So bold was he and his four companions in upholding the rights of the people that, on 4 January 1642, King Charles I, after calling the names of these five men, accused them of treason and demanded that they should be given up to him. Both Houses of Parliament refused and the City of London defended them by arms, thus foiling the King in his attempt to beat down the opposition.

He married a lady of good birth by the name of Joan Bernard and many descendants of this truly noble couple are still to be found in Great Britain, many of them still living in the town of Stroud, in the beautiful valley at the confluence of the Frome and Slade, which unite to form the Stroudwater.

Barnard Stroud came from Stroud, England, to America in the latter part of the 17th century and settled at Amwell, New Jersey. Here he married Keziah Harker, daughter of Samuel Harker of Amwell, who had come from the Island of Jersey. Barnard and Keziah Stroud later removed to Northampton County, Pennsylvania. They had a large family, nine of whom lived to adulthood. The five sons were John, Jacob, James, Barnard Jr., and Samuel. James went to Virginia and left many children. Jacob remained in Monroe County and was an outstanding leader of that time. He founded the City of Stroudsburg, Pennsylvania, was active in military affairs and early Colonial government.

Jacob Stroud with three brothers, John, James and Barnard Jr., entered the Provincial Army and participated in the engagement at Fort William Henry and the Plains of Abraham at the taking of Quebec (13 September 1759). Jacob Stroud was one of the three persons nearest to General Wolfe when he fell and helped carry him behind the works be-

fore he expired. Barnard Stroud Jr. lost his life at this same engagement.

Fort Penn, Northampton County, Pennsylvania (now Monroe County which was erected in 1836 out of Northampton and Pike Counties), was in command of Colonel Jacob Stroud. It was a simple stockade built around the home of its commander at his own expense about the year 1776. It was part of the 4,000 acres owned by Colonel Stroud, which he afterwards laid out into the town which bears his name. Colonel Stroud is spoken of as a doughty commander and a brave officer. He was Lieutenant Colonel of the 6th. Battalion.

Colonel Jacob Stroud was a member of the Convention that drew up the first Constitution of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, having been elected 8 July 1776. He attended the first meeting of the Convention which was held at Carpenters Hall, Philadelphia, 15 July 1776, being a Representative from Northampton County. He was a member of the Provincial Assembly 1781 to 1784. In 1776 he was appointed one of the Commissioners to meet at New Haven for the purpose of regulating the price of commodities in the Colonies. In December 1776 he was appointed by the Assembly to take subscriptions for the Colonial loan.

Monroe County, then embraced in Northampton County, early became identified with our war for independence, the first battle being that of Lexington 19 April 1775, and on the 22nd of the next month Lower Smithfield County was formed with Jacob Stroud as Captain. On 3 October 1775 he was promoted to the rank of Colonel.

Colonel Stroud had twelve children, all of whom survived him except Rebecca, who died in infancy. In February 1769, having paid for his first farm, anticipating in every instance the stipulated installment, he acquired title to three other parcels of land, together a little more than 300 acres. At the time of his death in 1806 he owned 9,000 acres of land and was very successful in operating a saw mill, grist mill, blacksmith shop, tavern and store. He left many landmarks in Stroudsburg that stand today. The Mansion House, built in 1795 by Jacob, is a three-story structure in which three generations of the Stroud family lived and is now a museum. The Penn-Stroud Hotel and several streets are named for the Stroud family.

After his service in the French and Indian War, John Stroud moved from Pennsylvania to Hillsboro, Orange (now Chatham) County, North Carolina. He married Sarah Connelly, two of their daughters marrying Stephen and Isaac Crow, sons of James Crow. John Stroud participated in the Revolution in the First Regiment North Carolina Troops in Captain Sharp's Company, serving from March 1777 to August 1778 (See N.C. Records XVI Vol. 2 - 1152). His son Mark was only 18 years old when he enlisted for service in the War of Revolution. He enlisted in the State Reserves. This service acted in a double capacity. When their service was not required to repel British invasion, they were sent home to make supplies for the regular army. This band of patriots was often called into service. Mark Stroud was engaged in the battle of Guilford Courthouse 25 March 1781. After the Revolution, in about 1789, John Stroud and his wife Sarah moved from North Carolina to what was then Franklin County, later Jackson County, now Clarke County, Georgia. Franklin County was created from original territory 25 Feb-

ruary 1784, Jackson from Franklin County 11 February 1796, and Clarke from Jackson County 5 December 1801. Their daughters Margaret and Elizabeth, wives of Stephen and Isaac Crow, had already settled here. The move of the John Stroud family from North Carolina to Georgia probably occurred at the same time as that of the Aaron Parker family, whose daughter Rachael later married Martin Crow, son of Stephen Crow.

John Stroud and his wife were charter members of the Mars Hill Baptist Church founded in 1799 and located about seven miles southwest of Athens, Georgia. This church is still active and some of the Crow family are current members. Stephen and Margaret Crow joined this church prior to 1806. Abner and Elizabeth Crow were also members about that time. The Stroud plot in the Mars Hill Cemetery includes grave markers for John and Sarah Stroud, Stephen and Margaret Crow. John Stroud lived to the ripe old age of 105 and was accidentally drowned in 1837. His descendants, of course, are now throughout this country. At this time Mr. W. E. Stroud lives in Athens, Georgia; his father, W. E. Stroud Sr., in Goldsboro, North Carolina, near Chatham County. They descend from Strouds of Orange County, North Carolina, and are obviously descendants of John Stroud. Also, a Mrs. LaVerne Moore (Stroud) Marchand who lives at 3335 Dartmoor Drive, Dallas, Texas, is a direct descendant of John Stroud and relates that many of her Stroud relatives reside in the Henderson and Nacogdoches, Texas, area.

THE PARKER FAMILY

The family was anciently seated in England, mainly in Counties Kent, Norfolk, Sussex, Cheshire and Essex; and in Ireland in County Cork.

Elisha Parker came from England to Barnstable, Massachusetts. He was born in 1635. Richard Parker came from England. He settled on the Nansemond River in Virginia in 1650 and had land grants for 2500 acres in Nansemond County. Thomas Parker came from England in the "Susan and Ellen" in 1635 and settled at Lynn, Massachusetts. William Parker came from England and settled in Portsmouth, New Hampshire, in 1703. Later, other members of the family came to all of the other colonies.

The Parker Arms are as follows:

ARMS - Sable, a buck passant, argent, between these pheons or, within a bordure engrailed of the second, pellettee.
 CREST - A cubit arm erect, habited sable, cuff argent, the hand proper, grasping a stag's horn, gules.
 MOTTO - ESTO QUOD ESSE VIDERIS.

The first records of the Parker family in America are found in an Assignment of Land from John Winns to Aaron Parker on 23 March 1746 in Northampton County, North Carolina. Orange County was cut from Northampton in 1770. This conveyance refers to the above Aaron Parker of Nansemond County, Virginia, indicating Aaron Parker moved from Virginia to North Carolina. As the family sheets indicate, the Parker family, Strouds and Crows later moved from North Carolina to Clarke County and thence to Henry County, Georgia. Many of their descendants still live in DeKalb County and other nearby counties to Atlanta, particularly Thomas W. Parker and his sister, Mrs. L. M. McDowell, of Conyers, Georgia.

Aaron Parker was highly regarded in his community and served as a Justice of the Peace, a very high office of that day, and performed the marriage of his grandson John Crow and Leacy Keen. The old Aaron Parker homeplace still stands and is in a good state of repair, picture of which is included herein.

Aaron Parker was born in Virginia. According to family history, he served as a soldier in the Revolutionary War. He married Charity Shuffield. In 1789 he removed to what was then Franklin County, later Jackson County, now Clarke County, Georgia. Franklin County was created from original territory 25 February 1784; Jackson from Franklin County 11 February 1796; and Clarke from Jackson County 5 December 1801.

THE KEAN FAMILY

John Kean was born in North Carolina about 1789 or 1790. He married Jerusha, surname unknown, who was born in North Carolina about 1785. From census returns it can be determined that he came to Georgia after the birth of John B. Kean on 11 June 1824 and before the birth of George B. Kean about 1828 or 1829. At the time of the 1830 census he was living near Aaron Parker Jr. in Henry County and it appears that living with him were his wife, four daughters and two sons. Later returns show that all of these except the youngest son were born in North Carolina.

John Kean purchased a part of Land Lot 219 of the 11th District of originally Henry (now Rockdale) County on 18 November 1833. On December 29, 1834, he purchased part of Land Lot 231; on 24 March 1836 he purchased all of Land Lot 220 and on 17 April 1840 he purchased more of Land Lot 219. Part of Land Lot 219 was still in the family in 1883 when W. M. Keen conveyed the SW 1/4 of that Land Lot to J. B. Keen. The west half of Land Lot 220 was conveyed to John Crow on 19 March 1842; 9 acres of that Land Lot were conveyed to Aaron Parker Jr. on 19 February 1859 and 92 acres of that Land Lot were conveyed to John B. Keen on 23 February 1859.

The Aaron Parker family lived nearby. Aaron Parker Jr. as administrator of the estate of Aaron Parker Sr. sold Land 227 on the first Tuesday in March 1833. This Land Lot was purchased by Aaron Parker Jr. on 4 June 1839. Aaron Parker Jr. had previously purchased Land Lot 229 on 23 February 1822. William B. Parker purchased Land Lot 226 on 20 June 1826. In the 1840 Census Aaron Parker, John Kean and John Crow all lived in the 622nd Militia District. In 1850 J. B. Keene lived in house number 1632; A. Parker lived in house number 1633; and J. Keene lived in house number 1635.

The records of the Ordinary for Henry County show a petition filed by John B. Keen on 28 February 1866 showing that John Keen "recently died". On 10 March 1866 Jerusha Keen as widow of John Keen, deceased, was awarded a "years support". Other records show that John B. Keen was appointed administrator, a petition for leave to sell land, a petition to compromise a Confederate claim due the estate, a petition for discharge 2 September 1872 and dismissed 6 January 1873.

It is probable that John and Jerusha Keen and Aaron Parker Sr. are among those buried in the Parker Family Burial Ground near where they lived. Among those buried here are an infant son of J. B. Keen and his wife Mary, and granddaughter Alie Frances and her husband J. C. Browning.

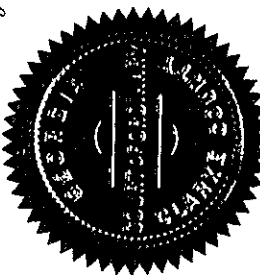

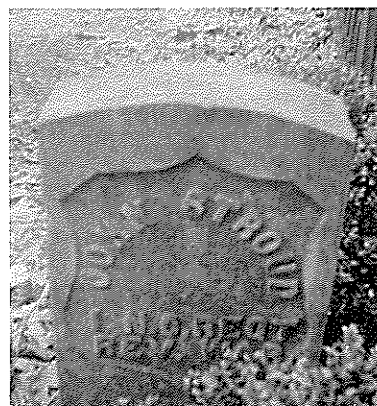
Mitford Crowe, Governor of Barbados.

1703. Upon the resignation of the Hon. Ralph Grey, the King appointed Mr. Mitford Crowe, an opulent London merchant, as Gov. of Barbados. The King's death preventing his departure, Queen Anne nominated Maj.-Gen. Sir Bevil Granville in his place. Crowe had served his apprenticeship to Mr. Tillard, a Barbados merchant, and had married Lady Chamberlayne of that island. (Schomburgk, 310; Poyer, 174.) She was Oriana, widow of Sir Willoughby Chamberlayne of B'os, Kn^t (he died at Chelsea in 1697). In 1707, in consideration of his eminent services at Barcelona, Crowe was appointed Gov. (Oldmixon, ii., 65.) But upon the change of ministers in 1710 he was removed. His death took place on 15 Dec. 1719. (Historical Register, 43.) The engraving has in the left hand corner: "T. Murrey Pinx:", and in the right "I. Smith fec: et ex:"

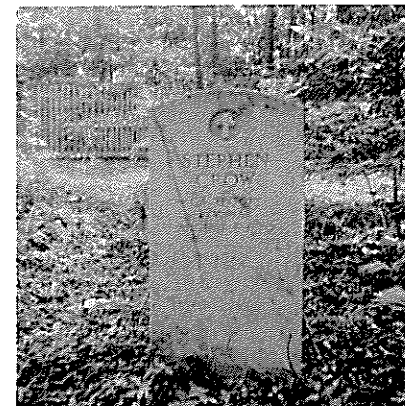

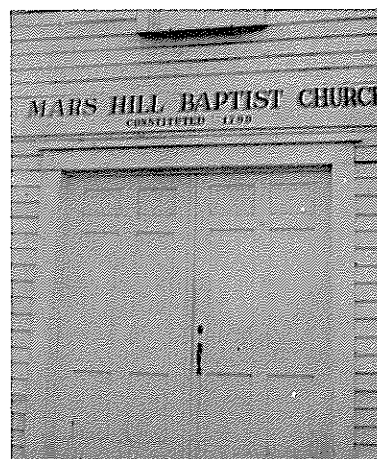

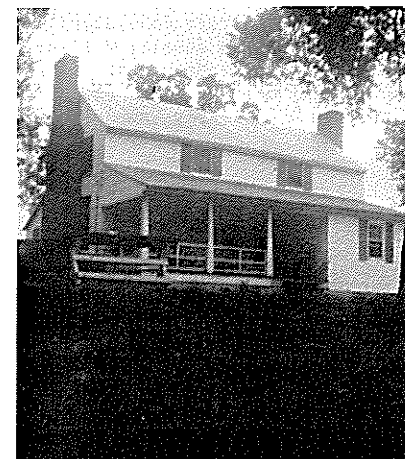
Grave marker of John Stroud, born 6 January 1732, died 1756.



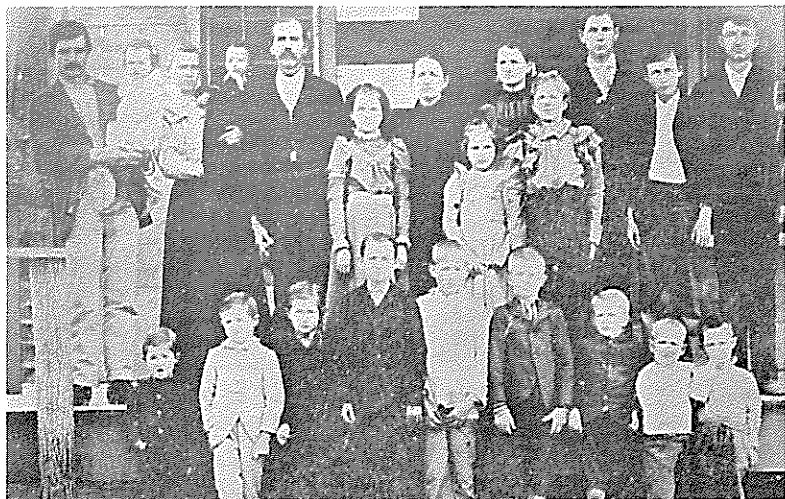
Grave marker of Stephen Crow, born 28 February 1750, died 6 August 1830.
